The co-design stage

We are now entering our latest phase of engagement which builds on the thousands of views that we have heard from patients and staff over the years. We are grateful for your valuable feedback and would welcome your views and thoughts in this next phase of the programme.

At this stage, we have the overall design of the centre, the size of the building and number of floors subject to planning approval. The building is being designed with flexibility in mind to ensure that it can be adapted to meet service requirements for the future. You can help bring the vision for Oriel to life by telling us what's important to you and how you think the building's design could support your needs. Every perspective is valid. We know that not everything will be possible, and there will be choices to make, which means it is all the more important that we hear your views.



What is Oriel?

Oriel is the joint initiative between Moorfields Eye Hospital, the UCL Institute of Ophthalmology (IoO) and Moorfields Eye Charity that would see our services move from their current premises near Old Street, Islington to a new, integrated centre on the St Pancras Hospital site.

Our vision is the delivery of a flexible and accessible centre that brings together eye care, education and research. The aim is to create a welcoming environment where patients will experience the best possible care and staff will have a workplace that inspires collaboration and innovation.

How to get involved

There will be different ways to get involved, including discussions hosted online, one-to-one conversations, questionnaires, and updates at meetings. We'll be publicising these in the coming weeks.

We'll cover the following topics:

- The Oriel experience – how the centre works, what's available for visitors and staff.
- The clinical event – how things could work for outpatient appointments and emergencies.
- Education and research – how the centre will support our latest advances.
- Patient support – how the centre helps us to create a better patient experience.
- Getting there – how transport serves the centre and support for patients to navigate “the last half mile” part of their journey.
